

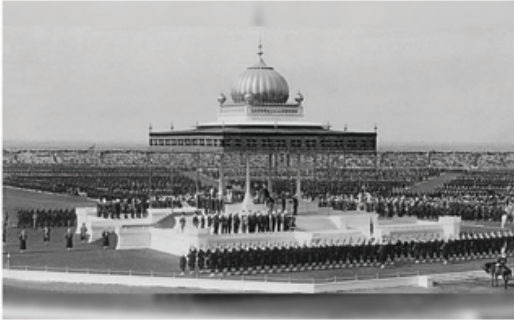


Welcome to the Kartavya Path

This majestic path stretches from the Rashtrapati Bhavan to the India Gate, housing various prominent government, cultural as well as other institutional buildings.

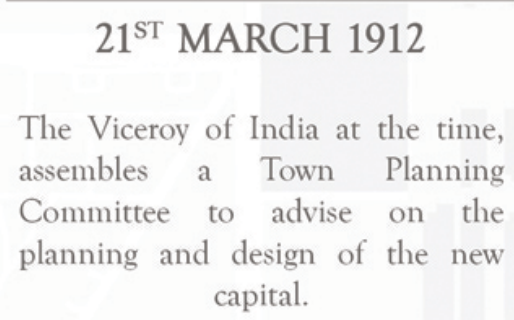
Formerly known as the Rajpath, translating to the 'Kingsway', this stretch was redeveloped and dedicated to the people as Kartavyat Path, when it was inaugurated on September 8, 2022, by Hon. Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi.

12TH DECEMBER 1911

Delhi is announced as the new capital of India at the Delhi Durbar of 1911.



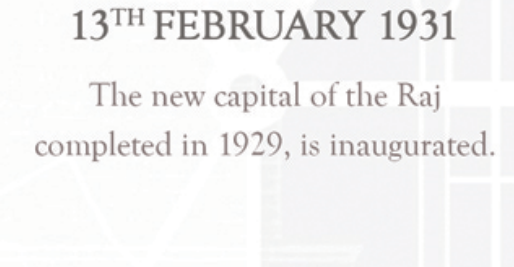
21ST MARCH 1912

The Viceroy of India at the time, assembles a Town Planning Committee to advise on the planning and design of the new capital.



5TH MAY 1912

Raisina Hill is chosen as the site for the new seat of Government. Edwin Lutyens and Herbert Baker are appointed as the chief architects.



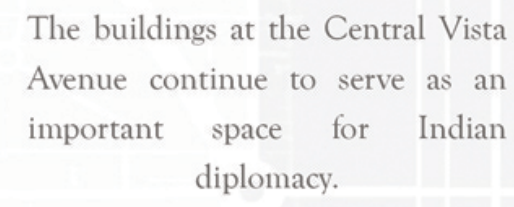
13TH FEBRUARY 1931

The new capital of the Raj completed in 1929, is inaugurated.



15TH AUGUST 1947

India becomes an independent Dominion in the British Commonwealth of Nations.

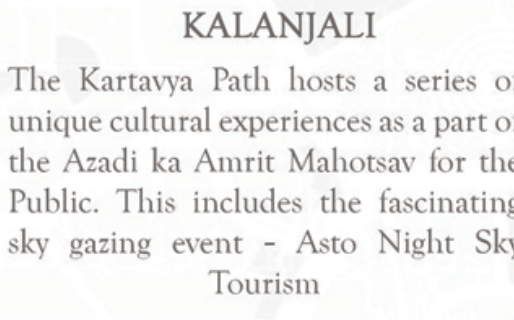


The buildings at the Central Vista Avenue continue to serve as an important space for Indian diplomacy.



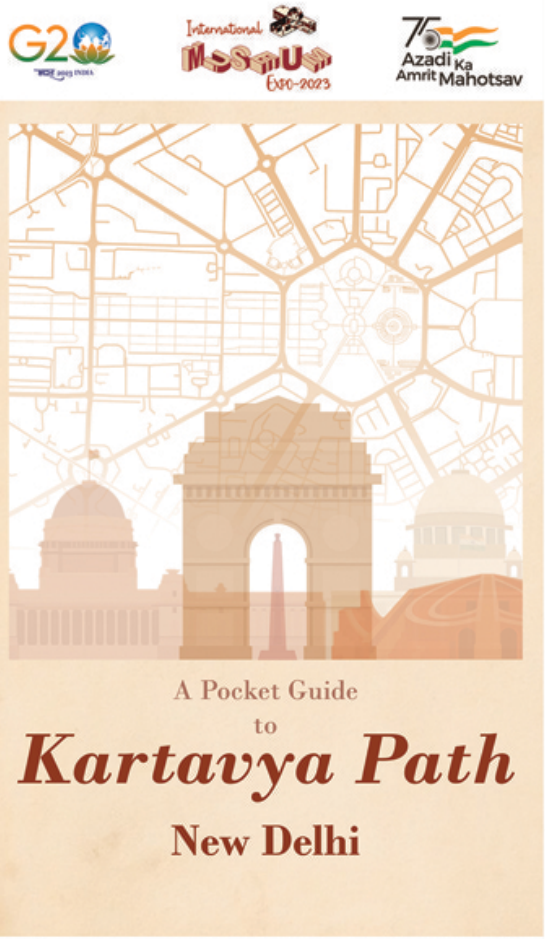
8TH SEPTEMBER 2022
